# **❖ A Message from the Pastor**

#### Life at School

We are well into the school year now. So much of what happens at school is more than just the subjects we study. There's a great deal of learning about how to get along with others and how to understand one another. Everyone's personality is different. Some are peaceful souls who quietly want to explore the world and life. Others are natural sharers who love to work together in groups. Then there are the competitive folks who thrive in sports and friendly challenges.

School life brings many blessings, but it also comes with its share of challenges. For some, school can feel intimidating; for others, it can be a place to push hard and strive to be first in line. Do we need to be popular? And, on the flip side, how do we cope when people say or do nasty things?

It's wonderful to want to do our best and to grow in goodness—but putting those ideals into practice isn't always easy. I hope that every child and teenager in St. Paul's Parish knows that they have a valued and important place in our parish family.



God calls us to be ourselves, though it can take time and effort to grow comfortable and confident in who we are. Our identity is uniquely our own, yet we all share a deep desire to belong. We are social by nature—and the same is true when we remember our soul. God has made us to be deeply social. Even God Himself is a community—three Persons in one: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Beyond the disrespect and unkindness sometimes encountered in the use of social media, we can also end up hiding the deeper truths about ourselves behind too much screen time or constant use of headphones. Don't be afraid—remember that you are God's own. I often tell adults

to be patient and to meet life's challenges one at a time. The same wisdom applies to young people, too.

We are blessed to have St. Paul as a model. He kept moving forward with faith and courage. He had friends, but even more, he had a heart wide open to the love of God. Read his letters—especially where he describes what it means to live a Christian life. They remind us that even in the midst of all our learning, activities, and friendships at school, we can cultivate peaceful and growing hearts.


## **Time Change - Sunday, November 2**




# All Saints Day and All Souls Day Mass Schedules
