A Message from the Pastor

Spirituality and the Wandering Mind

"I'm bored!" That was a refrain often repeated in our house. I remember thinking that my parents must have good answers to that problem.

Recently, I was listening to an academic on YouTube who observed that it's actually important to be bored. He noted that the phone has become our go-to distraction. When we stop focused attention and

allow our minds to wander, it activates a different mode in our brains. This is when deeper questions and feelings rise to the surface—and that's what often makes us uncomfortable. Avoiding these feelings has become so easy and socially acceptable. After all, what could be more normal these days than to see people scrolling on their phones?

The speaker's point was that in avoiding discomfort, we also avoid the very things that can give our lives meaning. Personally, I would add that love and life include a wide range of emotions and raise all kinds of questions. That's one reason turning to God—and to one another—is both natural and necessary.



He went on to offer several guidelines for a more balanced approach to phone use, which you might consider adapting in realistic ways for your own life. He avoids devices after 7 p.m. None are allowed at the supper table. He regularly takes deliberate breaks from technology—he even calls them "fasts," much like the fasts we speak of in our spiritual discipline. He also keeps his phone out of the bedroom at night. If you'd like to look him up, his name is Dr. Arthur Brooks.

He points out that these changes may feel uncomfortable at first, but we recover—and as we do, we reconnect more naturally with our deeper longings and questions. From that place, we begin to build a

life of meaning. For us in the Catholic tradition, this is quite familiar. In prayer, we strive to be present to God. In our interactions with one another, we seek to be attentive. And in our ongoing conversion, we aim to be real to ourselves.

Dr. Brooks also mentions our tendency to constantly listen to podcasts or music through headphones. Perhaps we're trying

to create our own little space in the world—but that bubble can easily become a barrier, separating us from others.

Is it any wonder, then, that so many people say they feel lonely? We can, of course, still use technology and enjoy the opportunities it provides. But we would be wise not to turn to it simply to fill the empty spaces in our lives. Real relationships are what we need—and where we thrive best.

Hurricane Melissa & Typhoon Kalmaegi — Humanitarian Relief

Category 5 Hurricane Melissa, the 3rd strongest Atlantic hurricane on record, devastated Jamaica and other Caribbean islands, destroying crops and fishing areas, and leaving many without power or telecommunications. Fuel and food shortages have worsened the crisis, with thousands displaced. Following Typhoon Kalmaegi the Philippines declared a state of emergency after over 200 deaths and widespread damage. Across the Philippines, Vietnam, and Thailand, floods, landslides, and debris have displaced thousands and continue to endanger residents attempting to clean up.

The Archdiocese of Toronto will accept donations and channel funds through our Catholic partners in the Caribbean and Asia to support relief efforts underway in both regions. Those wishing to help may do so in the following ways:
