❖ A Message from the Pastor

Taking Sacred Time in Advent

We have just begun the Advent season. In this part of the world, the days are getting shorter and travel can be treacherous, so many of us find ourselves staying closer to home. We might need a little something to lift our spirits and bring a bit of light into these darker days.

In many European countries, there is a tradition of the Advent Calendar—a small daily surprise for each day of Advent. Commercial versions often include treats, but you certainly don't need those. Creating your own Advent Calendar can be both simple, meaningful, and a lot of fun.

To mark each day, you can do a simple shared activity with family and friends: make a tree ornament, play a short game, pray together-especially a prayer of gratitude—bake something, or read a short story. You can use your Advent Calendar to build gentle rituals at home. Set up your Christmas creche one piece at a time. If you don't have one, try making your own figures and furnishings; that alone could take a week or two and will likely become an unforgettable memory. And perhaps it's a little radical to say, but this can be just as valuable for adults living together—or even for those who live alone. These practices aren't only for children.



For some, Christmas can also be a painful season. I feel that myself this year after the death of a family member. Our small rituals can help us mediate our grief or the difficulties we carry. Emmanuel is with us precisely because we have griefs, so the true joy of Christmas comes from God's presence in our real lives. We don't need a cheerful mask or to meet someone else's expectations—though Christmas can sometimes make us feel that way. By doing something simple and sacred each day until Christmas, we may discover unexpected consolations and encouragements along the way.

And of course, positive social time matters for all of us. Some of us—myself included—may be working around Christmas! So if you need to spend time together a little before or a little after the day itself, that's perfectly fine.

These Advent days will lead us to Christmas sooner than we expect. Treasure the time!

New to our Parish Community?

Welcome to St. Paul's Basilica! If you've recently, or not so recently, joined our parish community, please take a moment to fill out a parish registration form. There are many benefits to registering at the parish. It enables easier and more accurate donation tracking so you receive a tax receipt. It allows us to verify your information if you need a reference or are planning to celebrate or be part of a sacrament in the future. We can even transfer your records to another parish if you move. Forms are available at the back of the church or in the parish office.

Moving / Moved?

If your mailing address has changed we kindly ask that you notify the parish office by phone at 416-364-7588 or email at stpaulsbasilica@archtoronto.org, so we can ensure our records are up-to-date and there are no delays in issuing tax receipts.

Different Ways to Give

There are many ways to support the parish.

- 1. *Envelopes:* Registered parishioners can request assigned donor numbers linked to their records and pre-printed weekly envelopes. People using visitor envelopes who want to receive a tax receipt must *ensure that their name and address are clearly written.*
- Direct Debit: Donations can be debited directly from your bank or credit card and directed to a parish or archdiocesan fund.
- 3. *Tip Tap:* Simply tap your card on the device amount to donate. For a tax receipt, register your card.
- 4. **Securities:** By donating stocks, bonds or mutual funds you can avoid capital gains allowing you to give more.
- 5. *Time & Talent:* Donations don't always have to be monetary. Consider volunteering your time or abilities with a parish ministry or event.
