Contemplatives in Action

Yoda might say, "Contemplatives in action, we are all called to be." And truly, we are. Though the phrase is often associated with great contemplative saints like St. Teresa of Jesus (Avila), it describes any of us who are making a sincere effort to live a Christian life.

By the end of each day, we can feel a little jumbled. There are the daily blessings—those moments that stirred gratitude. Then there are the parts of the day that felt wasted. Most days also bring challenges or frustrations. Even if our own homes are peaceful, the news can weigh heavily on us, especially stories of war or famine. Some problems simply do not have quick solutions.

To be contemplative means not only allowing the raw material of our lives to be quietly joined to our prayers, but also consciously cultivating the truth that we dwell in Christ in the midst of it all. Our joys and our sorrows are held by God's love. This contemplation, in turn, frees us to act—to face our challenges and to bring about change, both visible and invisible, that is mysteriously joined to Christ's healing work.

Our actions are never perfect, but we believe that God is at work in every good we try to do, even haltingly. The saints became "great" precisely because they learned to live in this



freedom and to surrender themselves more and more to God.

Unlike those whose confidence is artificial, this way of living sharpens our conscience and allows us to be selfless with greater ease. Less energy is wasted on "what ifs" and worries, and more is given to acting helpfully and being at peace.

Simply being at peace this Christmas will give others the freedom to approach you. A little peaceful attention—a willingness to listen—can become a conduit for great good and quiet healing. We may even find that our own burdens begin to lighten as

we enter the present moment as a true encounter with the risen Lord, a sacrament of the present moment.

Christ is with us. On this Third Sunday of Advent, when we are called to rejoice, may we gladly give ourselves over to being contemplatives in action, treating every moment as one filled with grace.



New to our Parish Community?

Welcome to St. Paul's Basilica! If you've recently, or not so recently, joined our parish community, please take a moment to fill out a parish registration form. There are many benefits to registering at the parish. It enables easier and more accurate donation tracking so you receive a tax receipt. It allows us to verify your information if you need a reference or are planning to celebrate or be part of a sacrament in the future. We can even transfer your records to another parish if you move. Forms are available at the back of the church or in the parish office.

Moving / Moved?

If your mailing address has changed we kindly ask that you notify the parish office by phone at 416-364-7588 or email at stpaulsbasilica@archtoronto.org, so we can ensure our records are up-to-date and there are no delays in issuing tax receipts.

Different Ways to Give

There are many ways to support the parish.

- 1. *Envelopes:* Registered parishioners can request assigned donor numbers linked to their records and pre-printed weekly envelopes. People using visitor envelopes who want to receive a tax receipt must ensure that their name and address are clearly written.
- Direct Debit: Donations can be debited directly from your bank or credit card and directed to a parish or archdiocesan fund.
- 3. *Tip Tap:* Simply tap your card on the device amount to donate. For a tax receipt, register your card.
- 4. **Securities:** By donating stocks, bonds or mutual funds you can avoid capital gains allowing you to give more.
- 5. *Time & Talent:* Donations don't always have to be monetary. Consider volunteering your time or abilities with a parish ministry or event.
