
❖ A Message from the Pastor

Creation Being Transformed

It is not surprising for those of us in the northern hemisphere that we become a little contemplative at this time of year, when the nights are longest and the days are shortest. What does the darkness carry with it? For centuries, it meant that food could not be grown and work could not continue. We experience a little of that ourselves if we are among those affected by the changing seasons and find that we have less energy.

The Gospels of Luke and Matthew describe the surprising circumstances of Jesus' birth. In Matthew, we have the description of the star that appears and guides the Magi to the Holy Family. In Toronto, filled with light throughout the night, we are lucky if we see any stars at all. To our ancestors, those pinpoint lights that appeared at night were a basic part of their knowledge. The very idea we have of heaven is rooted in the vastness of a universe that could not be reached out to and touched. From this wide universe, light rests on such a humble place!

In Luke's Gospel, we have the account of the shepherds in their fields at night, hearing the chorus of God's messengers—the angels—and being drawn to the crib. In the midst of the chill of the night, warmth comes from the baby and his parents, and from the shepherds and their animals. A warm and



probably pungent place—and certainly a very humble one!

God did come to dwell among us, but the coming was anything but frenetic. There is a beautiful stillness here. I hope that as you celebrate Christmas this year, God comes to you in that stillness, even in the midst of the noise and activity that characterize our time together.

Traditionally, this is a time of year when we let go of our skepticism and look for the goodness that we may remember from an earlier time in our lives...or perhaps are still searching for. The "renewed" innocence that Christ brings, however, is not simply greater or better than the innocence we remember. It is the fruit of creation being made new according to the promise of God the Father.

We have been made new. At every Mass, especially, we are being brought to full stature in this new life. And like Christ's appearance, it sneaks up on us—it is a surprise that emerges from a humble place.

Just as we believe that God came to live among us and that Christ was fulfilling the Father's plan, so we believe that Christ has brought this new creation—the Kingdom—near to us, and that we have received His very self as our gift. That is why we call Jesus Emmanuel, God-with-us.






or scan the QR code or and hit the Donate button. Check that "St. Paul's Basilica, Toronto" is selected from the Parish drop down menu when signing up.
