❖ A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



A Few Thoughts on AI

The AI revolution is accelerating. While the rapid growth of artificial intelligence presents many positive opportunities, the lack of shared agreement about its ethical, legal, and even moral use is concerning. At its core, AI is the product of increased computing power: we can process more data, store more information, and connect it in increasingly sophisticated ways. As in many other industries that shape and provide us with the trappings of the modern life, these advances are largely controlled by a relatively small number of powerful players.

AI displays two seemingly contrasting approaches. On one hand, it offers remarkable precision in specialized fields with its ability to analyze vast datasets. Medical research, for example, is poised to benefit greatly. Cancer treatments may become more personalized, with genetic patient information guiding the manufacturing of medicines and accelerating discoveries. On the other hand, AI is also quite adept at providing generalized information. I find it useful to gain a basic understanding, or a summary of prevailing views and key facts on unfamiliar topics—though this requires careful attention to sources and credibility.

There is a line in an old and quite dated 19th-century Gilbert and Sullivan operetta: "I always voted at my party's call, and I never thought of thinking for myself at all." The character, who purchased his seat in Parliament and is lazy and negligent in performing his responsibilities, is made a cabinet minister as a reward. It is not hard to see echoes of these 1884 today. Those who choose use AI uncritically, or without a moral compass, may well be rewarded in our society.

We already know that "smart" technologies are used to collect and exploit personal data. It is reasonable to ask whether we are shaping machines—or allowing machines to shape us. Only within a moral, ethical, and responsible legal framework can we truly claim to be using these powerful tools, rather than being used by them.

It may be beneficial to think of AI as "simulated" intelligence rather than true intelligence. My father worked as an actuary, a scientific profession which analyzes probabilities. Similarly, AI operates by identifying patterns and likelihoods on a vast scale. Its algorithms—mathematical formulae—are not morally accountable, and their inner workings are, out of necessity, closely guarded and hidden from public view by the companies responsible the technology. AI can provide information that, on the balance of probabilities, is statistically plausible and often useful—but if we grant it authority or credit it as being more knowledgeable than ourselves without critical evaluation and reflection, we risk surrendering part of our moral agency.

I realize this is an unlikely and complex topic for a bulletin article, however it is important. As AI becomes more deeply woven into daily life, we should take note of the positive benefits along with the negative dangers and take the steps needed to ensure AI remains at the service of humanity so that we continue to act as moral persons with voices in the wider society.
